Entry Fee: \$0 per entry. There is no limit to the number of entries a school can make.

Word Limit: 300 - 500

Theme/Topic is open. Students may submit any piece of creative writing that is their original work.

Your <u>name</u>, story title, and word count go on the entry form along with your school, class/teacher details. The entry form should be emailed along with the stories as separate docx or rtf files to <u>jowarren@actrix.co.nz</u> by 30 September 2024.

Stories must include a title but must not include the writer's name since entries will be judged anonymously. Standard manuscript presentation conventions apply (1.5 spacing, indented paragraphs, plain font) Writers should be guided through an editing process aimed at perfecting their work before submitting it.

As our judges are not fluent in te reo Māori, all entries will need to be in English.
